### MARCH FOR SCIENCE IS MARCHING ON

In 2017, more than one million people globally gathered together in the largest event for science advocacy in history. On Sunday, April 22, 2018 March for Science Denmark unites again in Copenhagen, Aarhus and Aalborg to hold our elected and appointed officials responsible for enacting equitable evidence-based policies that serve all communities and science for the common good.

In Copenhagen, the March for Science will start at 13.00 at the Niels Bohr Institute by the entrance to Fælledparken, at the corner of Blegdamsvej & Frederik V's Vej. Ends at Julius Thomsens Plads at the entrance to Forum, where there will be talks and entertainment until 16.00.

In Copenhagen we also support the 3-day science festival hosted by Unge Forskere that take place at Forum from 22-24 April.

In Aarhus, March for Science begins at Bispetorv at 14.00. We will march through the streets around the city and back to Bispetorv, where there will be music and talks.

In Aalborg, the youth organisations of European Youth North Jutland, I-Life, StudyLife and UngEnergi Aalborg will March for Science. They will gather at 13:30 on Tolbod Plads (at the fountains) and march until 14:00 to begin the Earth Day celebrations

March for Science is for everybody who believe that knowledge and evidence should be the basis for political decision-making and social development; if you believe that no one in the world should be able to ignore, suppress, set aside, or deliberately misinform others about overwhelming scientific evidence and developments concerning the environment, climate, health, resource consumption and biodiversity that require action, then come along and join us!
